

Government Vaccination Programme 2011/12
Who is it for and Where is it available?

A) Seasonal Influenza Vaccination

Based on the recommendations given by the Scientific Committee on Vaccine Preventable Diseases (SCVPD), the Government will provide free seasonal influenza vaccination to the following groups of person in the year 2011/12. Other persons may consult their doctors for the need and details of seasonal influenza vaccination.

* **Elderly persons aged 65 years* or above living in the community** may go to private doctors enrolled in Elderly Vaccination Subsidy Scheme (EVSS) to receive seasonal influenza vaccine with Government subsidy.

** **People with chronic medical problems** mainly refer to those who have chronic cardiovascular (except hypertension without complication), pulmonary, metabolic or renal disease, obesity (BMI 30 or above), who are immunocompromised, children and adolescents (aged 6 months to 18 years) on long-term aspirin therapy, and those with chronic neurological condition that can compromise respiratory function or the handling of respiratory secretions or that can increase the risk for aspiration or those who lack the ability to care for themselves for their increased risk of complications and death associated with influenza infection.

*** **Children between the age of 6 months and less than 6 years** may go to private doctors enrolled in the Childhood Influenza Vaccination Subsidy Scheme to receive seasonal influenza vaccine with Government subsidy.

B) Pneumococcal Vaccination

Scientific evidence has indicated that pneumococcal and seasonal influenza vaccinations given together in the elderly population reduce hospitalization, complications and mortality. As such, the Government will provide a free *single* dose of pneumococcal vaccine to the following elders aged 65* or above and have never received the vaccine before (or have received one dose of 23vPPV before 65 years old and more than five years earlier).

* Elderly persons aged 65 years[#] or above may go to private doctors enrolled in Elderly Vaccination Subsidy Scheme to receive pneumococcal vaccine with Government subsidy. Elders aged 65 or above who have never received any 23vPPV before were recommended / entitled to receive free / subsidised 23vPPV. Subsidy for pneumococcal vaccination lasts throughout the year.

** People with chronic medical problems mainly refer to those who have chronic cardiovascular (except hypertension without complication), pulmonary, metabolic or renal disease, obesity (BMI 30 or above), who are immunocompromised, children and adolescents (aged 6 months to 18 years) on long-term aspirin therapy, and those with chronic neurological condition that can compromise respiratory function or the handling of respiratory secretions or that can increase the risk for aspiration or those who lack the ability to care for themselves for their increased risk of complications and death associated with influenza infection.
